



POSTDOCTORAL FELLOWSHIPS

Applications are invited from graduates, from any African university, who have achieved their Doctoral degree within the last 5 years for the National Research Foundation Postdoctoral Fellowships in Security and Justice at the Faculty of Law, University of Cape Town.

Successful candidates will be expected to work within, and support, the activities of the **African Security and Justice Programme (ASJP)** which, has, as its key objective, the development of research on multi-level physical security governance and environmental security governance with a particular focus on climate change.

Tenure: The Postdoctoral Fellowships are tenable for 1 year, renewable for up to 2 years contingent on satisfactory academic progress and the availability of funds.

Disciplines: Criminology, Sociology, Psychology, Anthropology, Political Science, Law and other related disciplines.

Value: R120, 000 per annum. Publication top ups are available.

Note: An application for tax-exemption may be made by the University on behalf of the successful candidate.

Application process requirements:

- A letter of application outlining the applicant's research interests.
- A C.V..
- Certified copies of all academic transcripts.
- An example of written work.
- Contact details of two proposed referees. The referees must be academics who have taught or supervised the applicant.

Rules:

Candidates should not yet have held any permanent professional posts, specifically as academics. Postdoctoral candidates can be any nationality. In terms of NRF requirements gender and ethnicity requirements apply. Please see <http://www.asjp.uct.ac.za> for more information about the programme.
