## **Tutu, Haffajee, Pityana, Lategan to discuss civic responsibility at UCT event**

**A Moral Imperative to Speak: What Does Civic Responsibility Mean in Our Troubled Times? Wednesday, 24 August 2011, 17h30-19h00, in LT1, Kramer Law Building on Middle Campus**

This public conversation will feature Archbishop Emeritus Desmond Tutu, who continues even in his retirement to speak on issues of moral integrity; Professor Bernard Lategan, the Ombudsman for Stellenbosch University and the founding director of the Stellenbosch Institute for Advanced Study; Ms Ferial Haffajee, the editor of City Press and a council member of the SA National Editors' Forum; Dr Siphon Pityana, the chairman of the Council for the Advancement of the South African Constitution; Khayelitsha community organiser Ms Noncedo Bulana; and SRC presidents Ms Amanda Ngwenya of UCT, Mr Ayabulela Mahlathi of the University of the Western Cape and Mr Jan Greyling of Stellenbosch University.

This event is organised by The Living Reconciliation Forum: a collaborative project between UCT Psychology Professor Pumla Gobodo-Madikizela, Private Law Professor Jaco Barnard Naudé, and the Institute for Justice and Reconciliation. The Living Reconciliation Forum aims to strengthen the connection between academic scholarship and current debates in civil society on the continuing need for reconciliation and reparation – in short, to help build a socially responsive academic ethic.
