The two musicians were awarded honorary degrees by UCT last year for their contribution to music and the role they played in fighting for democracy in South Africa.</p> <p>Semenya is an accomplished musical director and composer whose work includes conceptualising and conducting a Quincy Jones production at the Montreux Jazz Festival. He composed the African music for <i>Roots</i> and <i>The Color Purple</i>, which earned him an Emmy Award and Grammy nomination respectively.</p> <p>Mbulu has recorded more than 20 albums on renowned labels with highly regarded producers. When she left South Africa for the USA in 1964, she was already well established as a teenage star, having featured in the famous African Jazz and Variety show and the musical <i>King Kong</i>.
